**Aims**

- To create a new, enriched learning environment for the Early Years children. £7,000
- To embed Reception and Year One 'Readiness' and impact positively on standards.
- To continue working closely with the parents/carers of the two and three year old children establishing positive relationships and promoting the importance of attendance via the Learning Mentor. £9,915
- To provide "Family Learning" to assist parents/carers to help their children learn at home. £2,350
- Cost to school to release the Deputy Head Teacher from class responsibility to work with children eligible for pupil Premium to narrow the gap in learning. £57,604
- Lunch time support for the children to develop positive social and emotional skills.
