Key Vocabulary

Key Vocabulary	Definition
Cubism	Cubism is when an artist paints an object from different angles, all in the same picture.
Abstract Art	A type of art that uses shapes, colours and marks to create a pattern or image
Portraits	A portrait is a painting or drawing of a person. A self-portrait is a portrait of themselves by the artist. Oil paints Oil paint is a slow-drying paint
Primary colours	The colours that can't be made by mixing other colours. The primary colours are red, yellow and blue
Secondary colours	Colours made by mixing two primary colours. The secondary colours are orange, purple and green.
