Key Vocabulary

Atlas	Book of maps
Capital city	The city where the government sits. London is the capital city of England and the UK.
City	A large town. Liverpool is a city.
Continent	A very large area of land that consists of many countries. Europe is a continent.
Euro	The unit of currency used across most of Europe.
Human Geography	Features of <u>land</u> that have been made by humans.
Landmark	A building or feature which is easily recognised.
Ocean	One of the five very large <u>area</u> of salt water on the Earth's surface.
Physical Geography	Natural features of land. Such as mountains, rivers, lakes.
Temperate Climate	this middle section of Europe has cold winters and mild summers (e.g. U.K, Germany, Poland)



CLIMATE

There are 44 countries in Europe and 4 main climate types.

- Polar regions near the Arctic Circle such as Iceland, Norway, Sweden, Finland and Russia where tundra and icy glaciers are common
- Temperate climates, much like the U.K. where there is rainfall and deciduous forests (trees which lose their leaves in the winter)
- Mediterranean climates which are dry and hot and attract many tourists.
- Alpine climates which are mountainous and cold.
