<u>Vocabulary</u>	<u>Definition</u>
Physical Geography	Natural features and landscape of an area (mountains, jungles, volcanoes etc)
Urban	A developed area (typically a town or a city) with a large population
Rural	Areas outside the towns and cities with smaller populations, usually agricultural areas.
Urbanisation	When people move from rural to urban areas
