<u>Key Vocabulary</u>

- Pulse the regular heartbeat of the music, the steady beat
- Rhythm long and short sounds or patterns that happen over the pulse, the steady beat
- Pitch high and low sounds
- Tempo the speed of the music, fast or slow or in-between
- Dynamics how loud or quiet music is
- Timbre all instruments including voices, have a certain sound quality e.g. the trumpet has a very different sound quality to the violin
- Texture layers of sound. Layers of sound working together make music very interesting to listen to.
- Structure every piece of music has a structure eg introduction, verse, chorus ending, bridge, instrumental solo:
- Pentatonic Scale a scale of 5 notes

<u>Facts/Info</u>: Disco music includes strong drum and bass lines. It has quite a fast tempo with a steady dance groove and energetic electric guitar lines. Disco first
