
Amazing Activities

Warm-up games play and copy

Play instrumental parts with the song by ear and/or from notation using the easy or medium part.

Improvise using up to 3 notes Which challenge did you get to?

Compose a simple melody using simple rhythms

Perform & Share

Decide how you going to perform the songs. It tells an important story. Tell your audience how you learnt this song and why.

Staves	5 parallel lines on which notes are written to indicate its pitch
clefs	Placed on a stave, it indicates the name and pitch of the notes on one of the lines
Time signatures	(also known as meter signature, metre signature, or measure signature) is a notational convention used in Western musical notation to specify how many beats (pulses) are contained in each measure (bar),
Dynamics	Variation in loudness
Semibreve O	Time value of 2 minims or 4 crotchets
Treble clef	placing G above middle C on the second-lowest line of the stave
quaver 📘	Eighth of a semibreve or half a crotchet
timbre	Character or quality of musical sound
