- Create an archaeological dig and collect facts from the artefacts found.



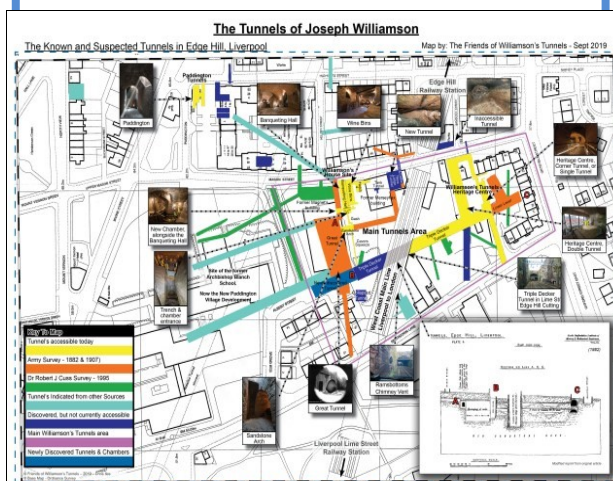
