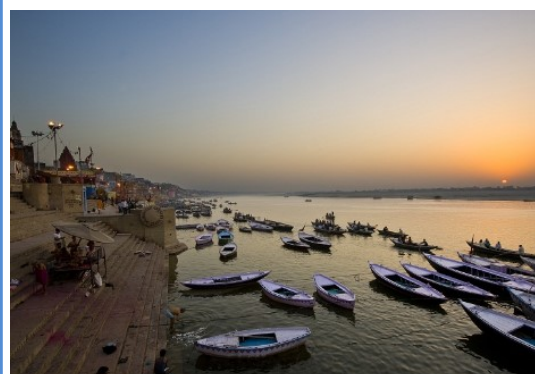

Key Vocabulary

bed	The river bed can be made of sand, rocks or mud
confluence	where two rivers join and become a larger river
continent	a very large area of land that consists of many countries. Asia is a continent
course	the channel along which the river flows
current	a steady and continuous flowing movement of some of the water in a river
delta	an area of low land where a river splits and spreads out into several branches before entering the sea
deposition	when a substance has been left somewhere as a result of a process
down-stream	The direction that a river flows, downhill towards the sea.
erosion	the gradual destruction and removal of rock or soil in a particular area by rivers, the sea, or the weather
meander	a large bend in a river
mouth	where a river flows into the sea
Oxbow lake	where a 2 meanders join together and create a shortcut creating an oxbow lake
source	where something comes from
tributary	a stream or river that flows into a larger one
