| <u>Vocabulary</u> | <u>Definition</u> |
|--------------------|--|
| Coast | The land near a sea shore |
| Coastal erosion | The removal of beaches or dunes by waves, tidal currents and human activity. |
| Coastal management | Defence against flooding and erosion |
| Human features | Features created by humans e.g. hotels, sculptures, buildings, piers etc |
| Physical features | Features that occur naturally e.g. dunes, cliffs, rock pools etc |
| Land use | Changes made to natural land, how the land is used |
