#### Key Concepts

- 1. Focus on learning names for food and drink and ordering a snack in a café.
- 2. Focus on learning the names of containers and packaging and the names of a range of ice-cream flavours.
- 3. Focus on learning useful café phrases, e.g. What's on the menu? How much does that come to?
- 4. Create a short play role-playing the waiter and customers in a café.
- 5. Focus on learning letter strings that rhyme.
- 6. Revise and assess learning throughout the topic.



- Understand basic grammar appropriate to the language being studied, including (where relevant) feminine, masculine and neuter forms; key features and patterns of the language; how to apply these, for instance, to build sentences; and how these differ from or are similar to English.
