## Key Knowledge

A self-portrait is a representation of an artist that is drawn, painted, photographed, or sculpted by that artist.

# Observational Drawing

# 1) Start with a circle, the add the chin. Erase the bottom of the circle. 2) Line of symmetry the add the chin. Erase the bottom of the circle. 3) Nose line is halfway between the chin and syeline. 4) Eyelida cover the tops of the halt. Don't draw every hair. Mouth line is halfway between the chin and syeline. 4) Eyelida cover the loss of the iris. Mouth line is halfway between the nose and chin. Hairline 5) Ears fit between the nose and chin.
