David Hockney was an important contributor to the Pop Art movement

Hockney uses flat areas of colour and texture to create distinct spaces.

An important aspect of a landscape is the perspective. All objects are smaller the further they are away from us.

Mixing primary colours red, yellow, blue create secondary colours.

Black can make a colour darker and white will make it lighter.

You can make many tones from the original colours

Hockney used photographs to create collages resulting in a new art he called 'ioiners'

Later on, Hockney used an Ipad paint app to create lots of art.
