### Amazing Activities

To work together to produce a large piece based upon the local area in the style of David Hockney with each child producing a piece to add to the class picture.



### Key Knowledge

David Hockney was an important contributor to the Pop Art movement

Hockney uses flat areas of colour and texture to create distinct spaces.

An important aspect of a **landscape** is the **perspective**. All objects are smaller the further they are away from us.

Mixing primary colours red, yellow, blue create secondary colours.

Black can make a colour darker and white will make it lighter.

You can make many tones from the original colours

Hockney used photographs to create collages resulting in a new art he called 'joiners'

Later on, Hockney used an iPad paint app to create lots of art.

### Skills

- Use sketching to record first hand observation.
- Represent things observed or imagined using a wide range of art and design techniques using colour, line, pattern, texture, line and shape in two and three dimension.
- Be able to make collages from a variety of media including photographs.

Key Vocabulary	Definition	
Colour	This is what we can see when light bounces off objects. For example red, yellow and blue.	
Line	A short or continuous mark made by moving a	
Landscape	All the visible features of an area of land.	
Perspective	The art of creating two or three dimensional objects on a two dimensional surface of a picture.	
Shade	The act of adding tone to a drawing. How light or dark a colour is.	
Shape	This is an area enclosed by a line. It could be just an outline, or it could be shaded in for example circle, square etc	
Sketch	A rough drawing or painting often made to assist in making a more finished picture.	
Texture	This is the way something feels or looks like it feels.	
Tone	This refers to how light or dark something is.
