

Key Knowledge

- Still life art is an arrangement of objects to create a visually interesting composition for painting
- Still life art uses different techniques, colours and tones to create a 3D effect.
- Still life representation of inanimate objects such as flowers, fruits, musical instruments has been practiced by artists since ancient times and survives in murals and mosaics from Pompeii and Rome.
- Understand observational drawing is an accurate representation of a still life picture.
- Know that still life can be used as a means to practice artistic techniques.
- Know that the colour, tone and texture of a painting can affect its meaning.
