




Welcome to the first reading newsletter of the new academic year! This is our new way of sharing all of the exciting reading activities



We'd love to see photographs of the children reading at home with their


family and friends if possible send a photograph on class dojo as a message or on the portfolio pages. Photographs shared will be used in school to create a whole school display.






Birthday Books


Poetry Recommendations

Poetry meets science and art in this beautiful picture book anthology of seathemed poems. Each double-page spread explores a different


aspect of the sea, from pebbles and sandcastles to whales and puffins to lighthouses and sailors.

A collection of sixteen energetic poems and rhymes to ignite the senses, with topics including fireworks, food, dragons and splashy puddles. Colourful illustrations make the


book a delight to look at as well as to listen to being read aloud.





Lower K52




A collection of poems for children who love solving brainteasers and cracking codes. The illustrated anthology includes riddles, acrostics, kennings and paradiddles.
